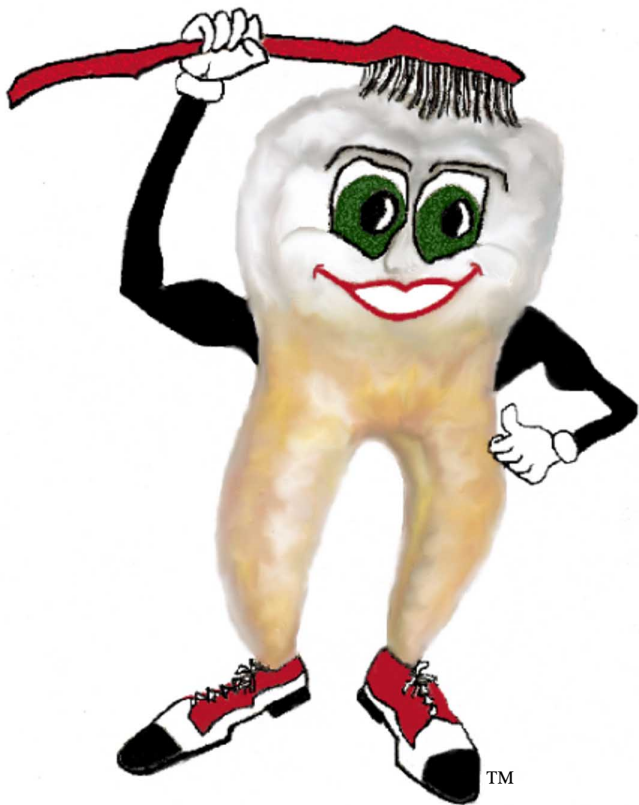
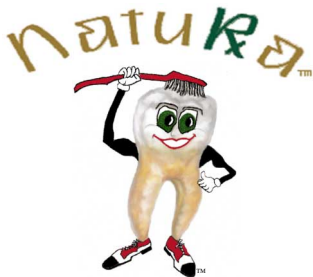

DENZI SAYS... BABY TEETH DESERVE RESPECT!

● To disregard the importance of baby teeth is disregarding the reality of childhood periodontal disease that can lead to early loss of teeth and erosion of bone that holds the teeth. This may create serious problems for the future permanent teeth.

● Baby teeth reserve a space for proper alignment of permanent teeth. Without proper spacing, permanent teeth may develop poorly and overlap.

● If baby teeth are not kept healthy, it may be difficult for the child to learn how to properly speak.

● A child with healthy, beautiful, teeth strengthens self-confidence and self-esteem. Children lose self-esteem when other children tease and ridicule them of bad breath, unattractive, or decaying teeth.

● Baby teeth are important for ease of eating, proper digestion, and nutrition. These teeth have a strong influence on the body's development.

● For babies: Since teeth develop under the gums before birth, it is important to focus on proper oral hygiene after 3 months of age — even before the first baby teeth are visible. A very gentle wipe of the gums and under the lips after feedings and at bedtime can be performed using a fresh, damp, soft gauze pad to which 2 or 3 drops of *Dentizyme Kidz™* is applied.

● Teaching your child proper oral hygiene is a lesson maintained for life. After children brush on their own, it is wise to repeat the brushing for them.

● Bring children for regular visits to their dentist by age one. A dentist can suggest proper brushing technique and an age-appropriate toothbrush.
